HUNDREDS OF ENQUIRIES were received in response to just one national advert as teachers competed for jobs at Thomas Telford School. Applications arrived from mainland Europe and the U.S.A. along with

WHO MANAGES THE SCHOOL?

The day to day running of Thomas Telford School is organised by Headmaster Mr Satchwell, and his team of seven senior deputies. WAITING LISTS ALREADY!

ALL 180 PLACES in the First Year at the Thomas Telford School have been allocated. The School is delighted with the confidence demonstrated by the parents of Telford and Wolverhampton.

Sadly there was some disappointment for those unable to secure a place because parents were unable to move into the catchment area. A small number of places were offered to students on the waiting list.

The School is keen to streamline the admissions procedure and is already drawing up guidlines for next year's intake.

THOMAS TELFORD SCHOOL TEAM


Headmaster, Mr Kevin Satchwell, started his new post in January with a team of three deputies, Miss Vivienne Evans, Mr Victor Maher, and Miss Hilary Phillips.

The major thrust of their work so far has been staff recruitment, forming links with industry and shaping the innovatory curriculum. The nerve centre of operations has been Telford Development Headquarters at New Town House, but this month will see a move to larger premises at Darby House to accomodate new staff as they join the team.

A NEW STYLE OF LEARNING

THE OLD DAYS of lining up in the playground waiting for the bell to ring have gone! At the Thomas Telford School students can arrive between 8am and 9am and go straight to work, after registering themselves through their personal computer and ordering their meals for the day. The day will include group meetings and an action plan session to determine individual activities. The students will have to collate a summary of their

progress to show and discuss with their parents daily. Opportunities to remain on site working until 5 pm will be provided.



PARTNERSHIP WITH INDUSTRY

One of the hallmarks of the Thomas Telford School is its special relationship with partners in industry and commerce. The newly appointed teachers are already working closely with local employers designing courses which are relevant to tomorrow's workforce.

Students can expect to have regular contact with employers

both in school and when they go out on work placements, (a regular feature of sixth form life.).

Breakfast will be served daily and students will be able to choose from a wide menu in the self-service restuarant. We also intend to provide light evening snacks as well as a choice of lunches. Working a longer day than most schools, it is important that an appropriate catering service is available. Tenders are currently being drawn up to ensure the school secures a quality catering company which gives value for money.

UNIFORM NEWS

A distinctive new uniform has been especially designed for the First Year. All students will wear a burgundy jumper, bearing the school's insignia, the school tie, a white shirt and a black blazer. Mid-grey trousers (optional for girls), or skirt, completes the outfit. Jumpers and ties will only be available from the School. Full details regarding uniform and sportswear will be distributed to parents later this year.


In the Sixth Form the School aims to create the same environment as a modern city office. Students will be expected to adopt smart office dress ie. collar and tie with jacket or suit. This affords some choice and prepares students for off-site work placements.

SIXTH FORM PLACES

The number of sixth form places has been increased to meet the anticipated growing demand as students complete G.C.S.E. courses. 80 offers have already been made to prospective students. Parents and students have already met with senior staff this month. Information Evenings were held over five nights at the The Telford Racquet Centre. Parents were able to meet in small groups to discuss plans in depth and students were given the opportunity to express individual course preferences with teachers.


TRANSPORT
