- To organise social functions



using the Z88 to send messages into school. Every two or three weeks there will be an update on each student's progress which you can access via the PARENT FILE. All you have to do is follow this simple process:-

- Press the two SHIFT keys to switch on.
- Ensure the cursor is on PIPEDREAM on the control panel.
- Press ENTER to access PIPEDREAM.
- Press  $\Diamond$ FL and key in the word PARENT.
- Press ENTER and you can read the report.

On October 15th the School participated in Shropshire's Eurofest programme. Five students accepted an invitation to attend the Lloyd's Bank seminar" Meeting The Challenges Of the Single European Market". This featured Mr. Christopher Nevin, Lloyd's Bank International Manager and was held at the Shropshire chambers of Industry and Commerce in Telford.

The five students Amanda Arnold, Andrea Tudor, Sharonjit Sandhu, Richard Cadman and Nick Andrews are currently studying for a BTEC award in Business and Finance. They were the only students from within the county to attend this prestigious event. Issues under discussion were Banking, Exporting into Europe and the Development of the Ecu, (the contentious European currency unit).
