You organise each of these yourselves

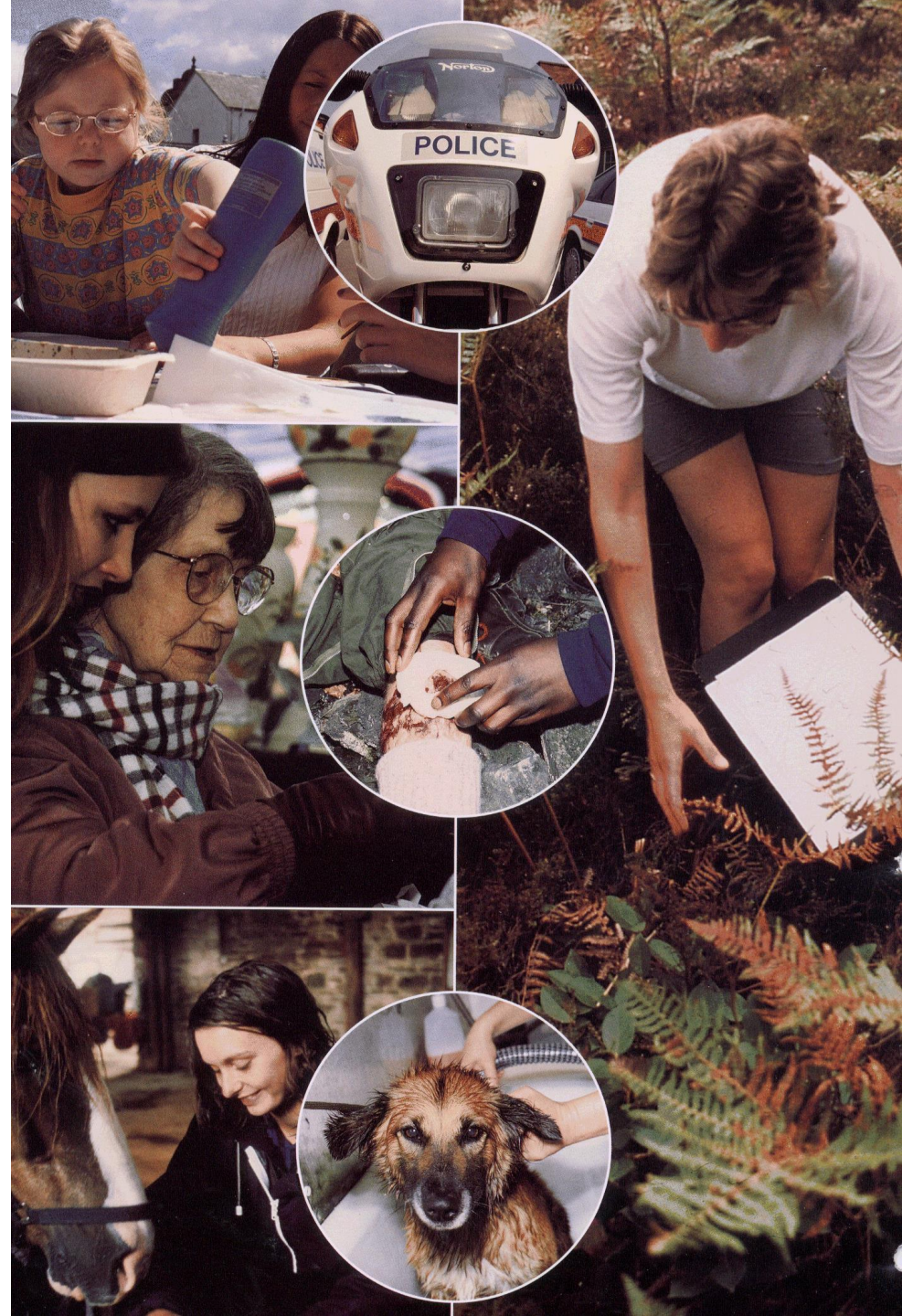
You must have an assessor for each section who will write a report for you once you have completed it

Examples

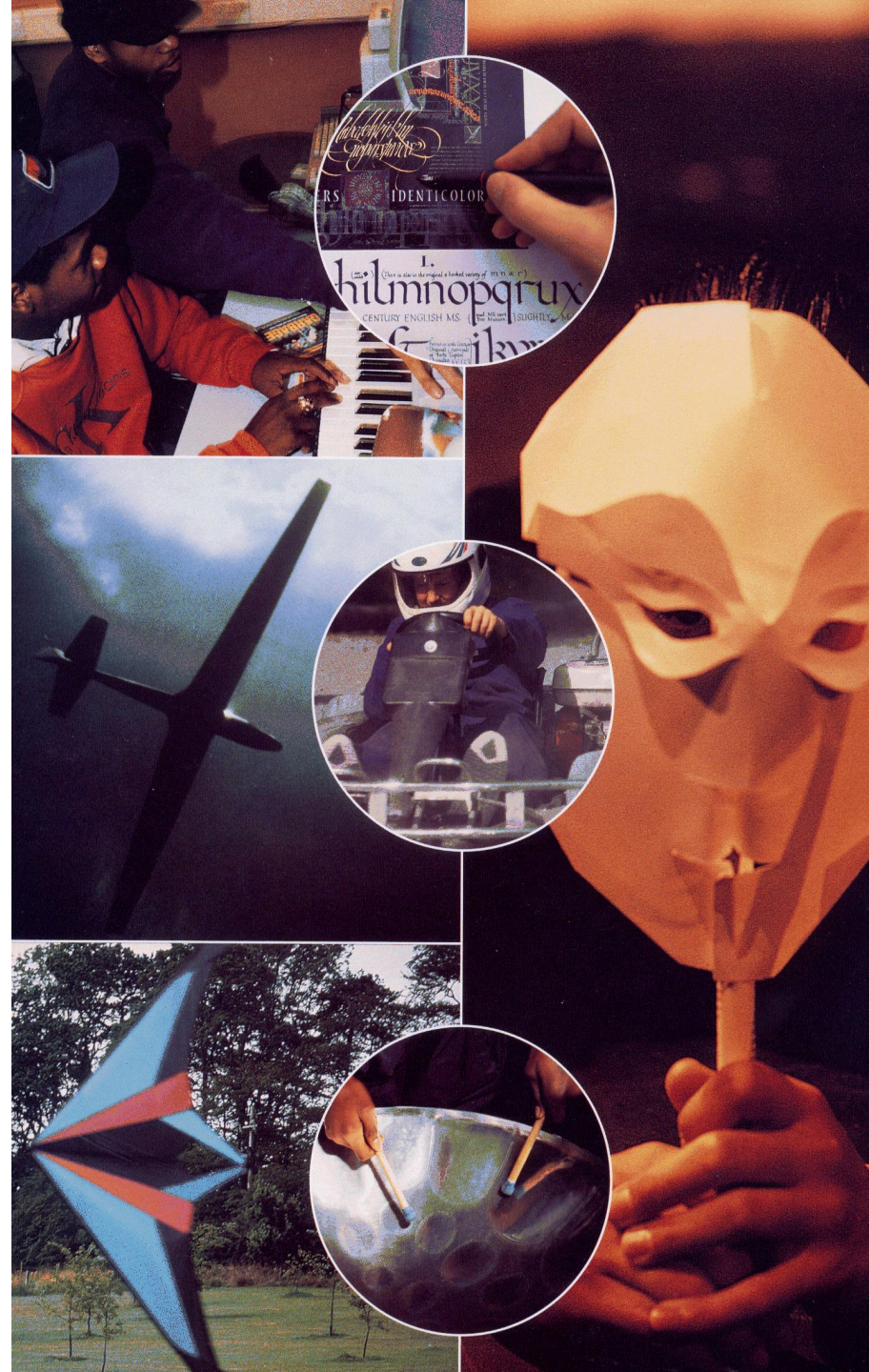
- Help at your local sports team with a younger age group

Examples

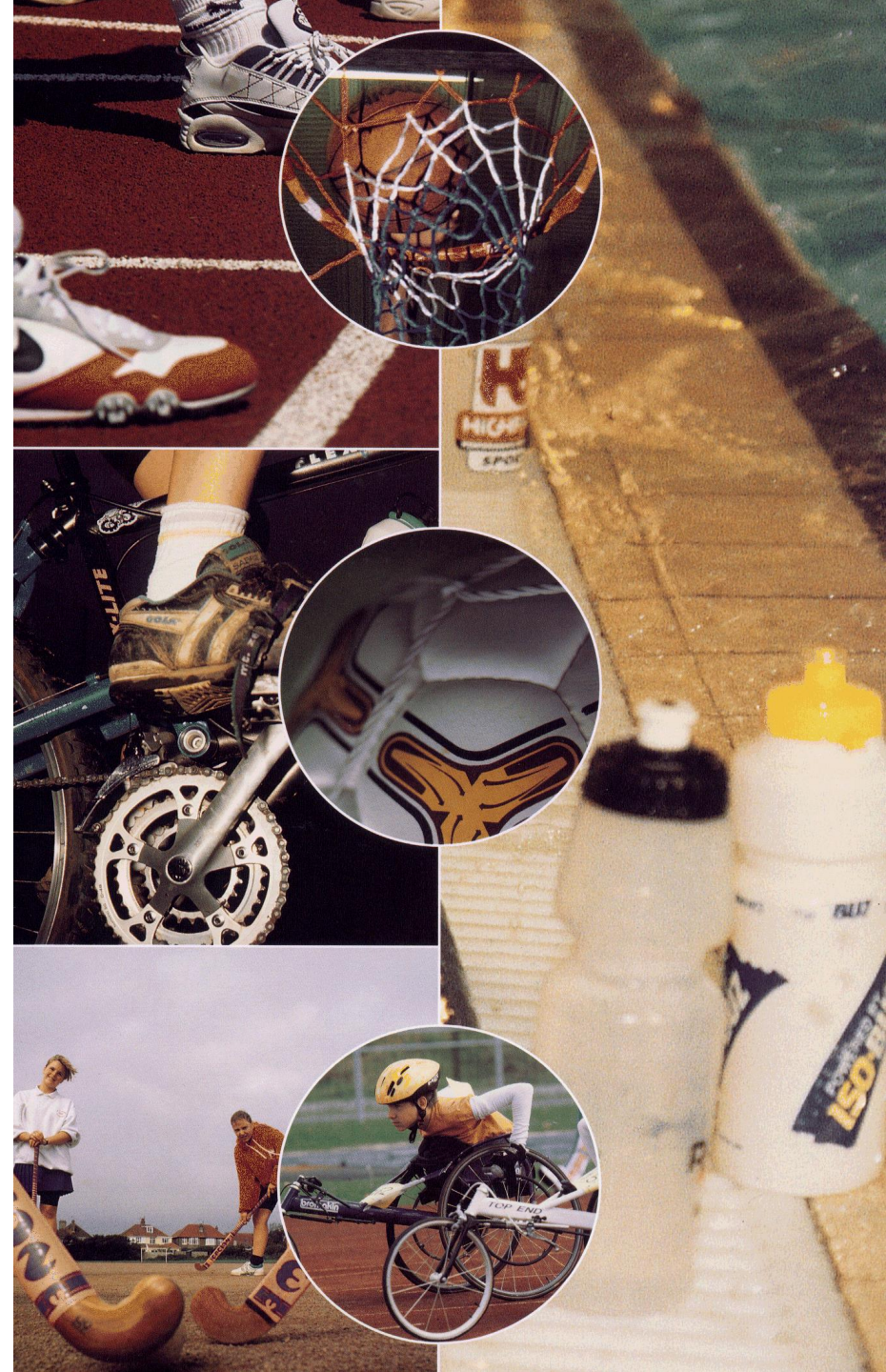
- Learning to play an instrument

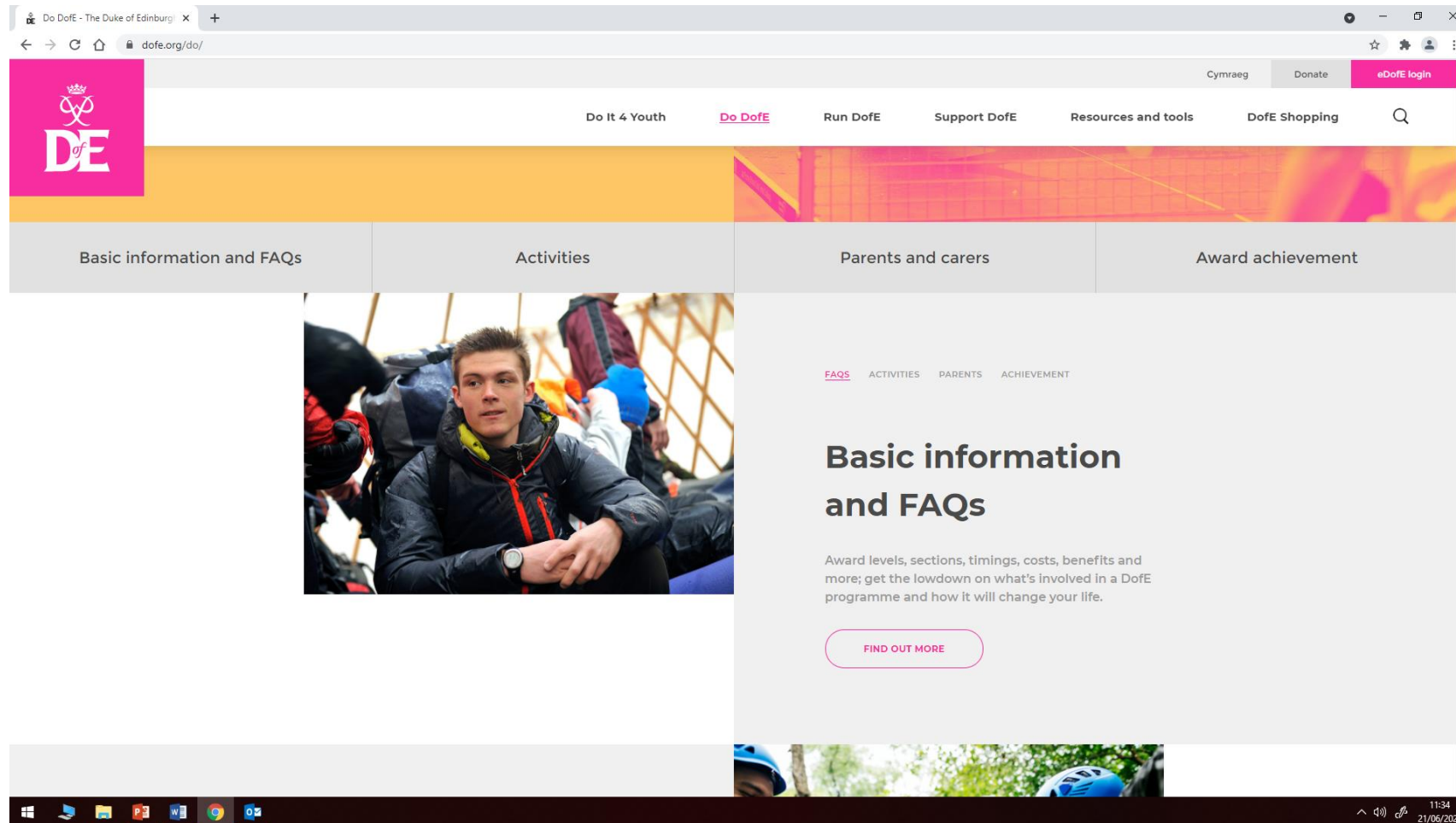
Bronze Award Cost

- All other kit will be provided by the School

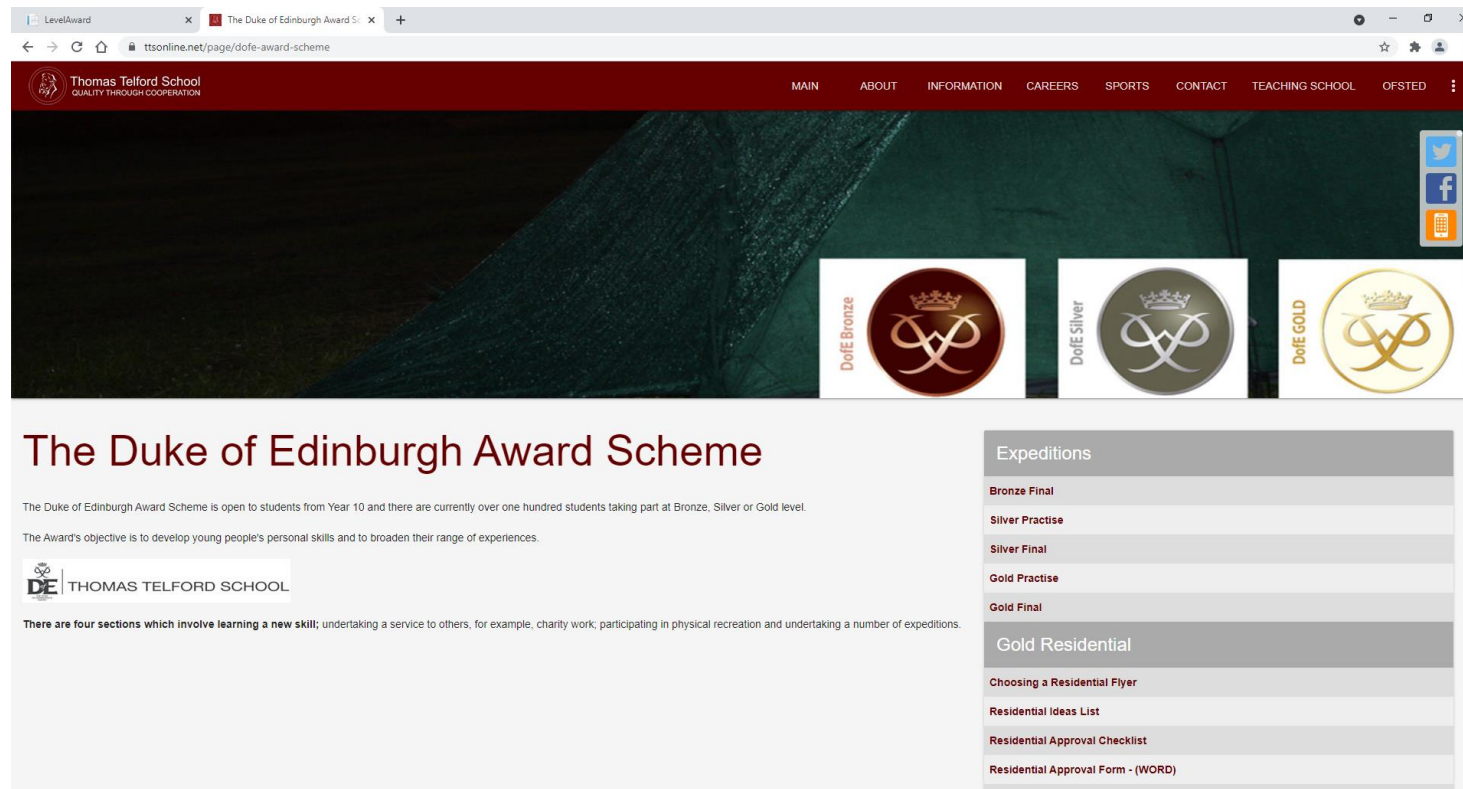

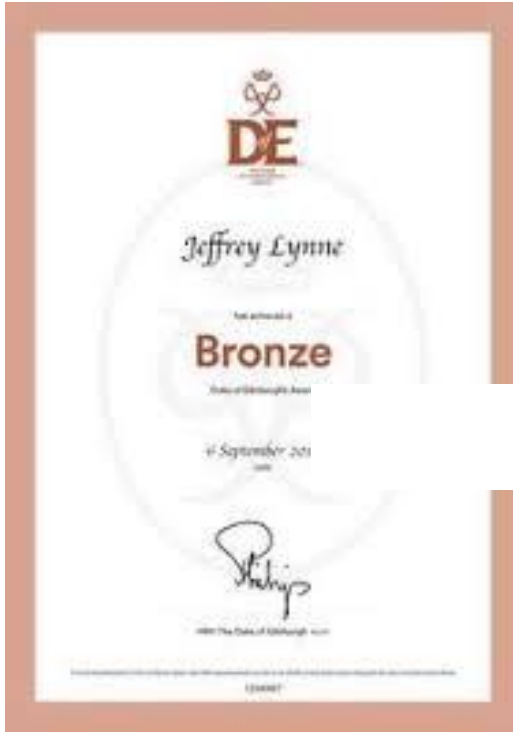

Behaviour expectations

- The behaviour when attending the Session 3's, training days and expeditions are the same expectations as when you are in School.
- If there are behaviour concerns the normal School protocol will be followed.
- If we feel your child is not ready to take part in the expedition after receiving the training, your child will be asked to defer until the following year, when again this will be assessed.





What to do next?

A letter will be going home with instructions of how to make the £95 deposit to secure your place. The final balance of £100 will be due at the end of October.
