Theatre Lights

- **Spot** beam of light on a specific area of the stage
- Flood a general wash of colour, everywhere lit up
- Fresnel softer edge than a flood, can light up specific part of the stage without a definition of the circle outline
- Strobe flashing light
- Blackout no lights on stage
- Lighting cue when to move to a different state
- Lighting state what is happening in the scene
- Transitions quick/slow/fade

• Levels – how bright you make the lights

- Red = Anger, Fear, Danger, lust
- Pink = Love, innocence
- Yellow = Bright, Happy, Day-time
- Amber = Awakening, Warm
- Green = Jealousy, Calming, Earthy
- Blue = Water, Night-time, Sad
 - White = Open, Pure, Natural



- Clothing (Dress, Shirt, Tights, Skirt, Trousers)
- Shoes (Boots, Pumps, Stilettos, Flipflops)
- Accessories (Watch, Necklace, Earrings, Ring)
- Hairstyle and wigs



The **set** is what's used on the stage that communicates the scene, they do not move during the scene.

A **prop is** an object used on stage by actors during a performance. It is anything movable or portable on a stage.




Types of Stages


Proscenium arch – A traditional stage type where an arch frames the opening between the stage and the auditorium
In the Round - A type of staging that has a central performance area enclosed by the audience on all sides
Traverse – A type of staging that extend across with the audience on two side opposite each other.
Thrust - a performance are that projects into the auditorium with the audience sitting on three sides.
