TASK 1 – Read OR watch 'Ways of Seeing'


'Ways of Seeing' by John Berger (1972) is considered one of the most influential Art programmes and books ever made. Reading this book in my first year at Uni made me think differently about the visual arts – so I highly recommend that you EITHER read the book OR watch the episodes (the book is small and concise – don't worry!). I know it's 'old' ...but it will stretch the way that you think about Art!

YEAR 13 – PREPARATION FOR ART SUBJECTS AT UNI TASK 2 – Find the reading and materials list for your course

Many universities may have sent you a reading and materials list already; others may have them published on their websites. If you haven't heard from your first choice of uni then it may well be worth either phoning them or emailing them to ask for a reading list for your first yearfind out what books and materials you will need. You could then get yourself organised and start some of your reading before you start the course.

If this is not possible – then think about what books might help you on your course (for instance – is there a particular artist or architect that you will want to study at some point on your course?. Have a look online at what books you could order or download to read before starting your course. This could really enhance your learning and development of ideas later down the line – as you will find so much more information, opinion and in depth analysis in a book as opposed to researching purely on websites!

TASK 3 – START A SKETCHBOOK

Drawing and researching will be an integral part of your course. Start now by creating a sketchbook ... this can be in a bought sketchbook or you can make your own (see some ideas in following slides). Your sketchbook doesn't need to be neat and tidyit's all about thinking on paper. Ideas of what to include in your sketchbook/pages: Collages of images (printed/magazine/newspaper) Drawings from images you have collected > Drawings from objects of photographs > Notes or key words relating to your ideas Stuck down mages/textures that you may work into, extend or draw from

- Poems or other text/data you have found
- Experiments in different media/materials

TASK 3 – IDEAS FOR A SKETCHBOOK

Your sketchbook can be about anything you like ... it could be on a particular theme or it might be a more random collection of images and thoughts. The most important thing is that you keep up your practice of drawing and recording **Suggested themes:** > Any topic related to your course > My environment Feelings and emotions Diary/journal

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
TASK 3 – SOME SKETCHBOOK IDEAS...

A thin sketchbook I made myself using several sheets of folded paper with ends torn/ripped. I painted and drew into other papers and collaged them in then added stitching also using a sewing machine
