We are studying life in the Middle Ages and have looked at the Church, medieval towns and villages, Thomas Becket, the Magna Carta, the Black Death and the Peasants' Revolt. · Read! It could be non-fiction, historical works, newspapers, or online material, but then ask them to assess it as a source using their skills. · Visit historic sites/museums/online displays. E.g. Worcester cathedral where King John is buried or Lichfield Cathedral. The Church of St Editha in Tamworth is a well-preserved medieval church · Historic sites and museums also have useful resources on their websites. · • Watch historical documentaries and programmes together (e.g. Dan Snow/Horrible Histories)
