

Subject	Year 9 Threshold Concepts – Term 2	How to support students' learning
<b>Music</b>	<p><b>Rock &amp; Pop</b></p> <p><b>Listening:</b> Students will explore the evolution of rock and pop music from 1960s-2010s. They will discover how the musical elements are used in each of the decades with particular reference to certain influential artists.</p> <p><b>Performing:</b> Students will be developing their sight-reading skills on keyboard. They will be able to use both hands together to produce the chords and the melody.</p> <p><b>Composing:</b> Students will compose their own song on either Cubase or Sibelius. 	<p>Students will compose a piece of film music to accompany a video taken from Harry Potter. Students will create their own leitmotifs and develop their ideas alongside a storyboard, using cues in the video to inform decisions in the music.</p>	
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
