Top Comprehensive School Again!

It is with great pride and pleasure that I am able to write to parents after a most successful year.

For the second year running, Thomas Telford School is the highest scoring comprehensive school in the Shropshire and Wolverhampton area. Out of 4,000 comprehensive schools nationally we are rated thirteenth with our GCSE results.

Every one of our Year 11 students achieved five or more GCSE passes with 85% gaining GCSE/GNVQ equivalent of five or more A*-C grades. I am confident that next year we can sustain and marginally improve these very high standards at GCSE examination performance.

The students, staff and parents deserve great credit for all their hard work and support.

Special thanks go to members of the local community and industry who contribute so willingly towards the learning opportunities of the students here. It is no accident that over 400 companies collaborate and liaise to support the educational achievements of our children.

We have also improved in the Key Stage 3 National Curriculum Tests (SATs) for the fourth year in succession. Our Year 9 students excelled themselves by achieving passes at Level 5 and above of 89% in English, 92% in Mathematics and a massive 96% in Science. Our combined average score was 92.3%. Set against the national average of 58.6%, these results will place us amongst the top schools nationally.

Academically, as each year passes, we go from strength to strength and I am deeply grateful to everyone who works to support the students. Well done!!



Ricoh

As part of their GCSE coursework, a group of Year 11 ceramics students have undertaken a project on behalf of Telford-based company Ricoh UK Products Ltd.

Parent of a pupil at TTS, Ricoh Public Relations Officer, Mrs Christine Petrovic, had been very impressed by the ceramic "map" of Telford in the School's reception area and she commissioned a similar map for Ricoh's factory. Two groups of students worked on separate designs and Mrs Petrovic selected the most appropriate finished piece. Each student had responsibility for designing and making individual pieces of the giant ceramic jigsaw and the teams worked together to produce a visually unified whole reflecting many of Telford's most notable features.

EDS (Electronic Data Systems) Ltd is a large company, employing some 2,000 people, with premises in the centre of Telford. EDS commissioned the School to design and produce two projects for their smartly refurbished reception area at Boyd House.

Sixth Form GNVQ students took charge of both projects. One was to produce a large ceramics piece reflecting the diverse nature of EDS and the other was to design a huge reproduction of the EDS logo to be made from computer and other electronics components.

St Georges Park Care Centre

This recently built centre is a 19 bed unit for elderly mentally ill patients. Students were asked to design and paint murals along the corridors, recreating images of the residents' childhoods.

Two GNVQ Art & Design students, Scott Paterson and Paul Wilcox enthusiastically seized upon this opportunity to undertake a project that would not only be a useful social service but would also support their GNVQ course. The students negotiated the brief with staff at the centre and approached DIY outlets for donations of paint. B & Q were particularly helpful in offering free materials.

Throughout the three week project, the students worked professionally and conscientiously and the Centre Managers were delighted with the end results.

GKN Engineering Project

Sixth form students took part recently in a project sponsored by GKN and organised by the West Midlands Region of the Engineering Education Scheme.

The students, Michael Brookfield, David Burgess, Edward Hole, Craig Jones and Anthony O'Connor undertook a project with GKN Sankey Ltd to devise a system to collect ejected Ford Mondeo chassis parts for quality assessment. They were advised by engineers from Birmingham University and Thomas Telford School teachers, Messrs Mark Hudson, Jonathan Boyle and Rod Hughes.

Mr Hudson commented: "This project has been excellent experience for the students. The university involvement combined with working alongside engineers at GKN has given them a broad view of engineering as a career. The outcome was both dynamic and functional; a full size version of the system is under construction at GKN. The students and engineers have produced a real solution to a real problem. Congratulations to all concerned."

Ballet Workshop

Professional dancer, Gareth Griffiths, from Ballet Rambert was in School in May, working with a group of Year 10 GCSE Dance students. Katherine Murray, one of the students commented:

"The evening before the workshop, some of us watched a performance by Ballet Rambert in Birmingham.

When he came into School, Gareth Griffiths discussed the performance with us and then taught us a movement phrase from "Moonshine" by Christopher Bruce.

First of all, we learned the basic movements, practising several sequences before piecing them together. We then had to choreograph a motif to fit in at the end of the dance using words from the lyrics of the song.

It was fascinating to see how the dance developed and very interesting to make our own contributions towards it."

Junior Mathematicians Rise to the Challenge

Thomas Telford School students have successfully completed the UK Junior Mathematical Challenge which is held annually throughout the country. Fifty-three Year 7 and 8 students took part in the Challenge and received a total of twelve Bronze, eight Silver and five Gold Certificates.

Of the five students who performed exceptionally well and were awarded Gold Certificates, three are from Year 7 - Joanna Clark, Sandra Millin and Hannah Isaacs Two Year 8 boys were also awarded Gold Certificates: Bachrun Mason and Joe Noss. Bachrun also received a special certificate for "Best in School".

Mr David Berry, Deputy Head in charge of Mathematics commented: "The aim of the UK Junior Mathematical Challenge is to encourage and stimulate large numbers of able youngsters. The students enjoy taking part in a national event and enjoy the challenge that these mathematical problems pose. I am delighted that so many of our students took part this year and congratulate them all on their achievement."

As part of their Business Education course, Year 8 students studied competition, focusing on the rivalry between airlines.

First Officer Adrian Bagnall from British Airways at Heathrow visited the School and gave the students a presentation on the airline's history and services.

Business teacher, Mrs Julie Wilde, commented: "The students were fascinated by his presentation and asked lots of detailed questions about his experiences as a pilot. I feel that this is an excellent example of how industrial links can serve many purposes, in this case helping the students with their studies whilst developing an awareness of career opportunities."

Adding Spice to Science

Earlier this year a group of Sixth Form Biology and Chemistry students spent a few days in Arthog, North West Wales undertaking Ecology fieldwork. They were able to use local resources to complete their coursework as well as having the opportunity to participate in outdoor pursuits.

Students Davinia Boulton, Michaela Baily and Lee Jenks commented: "We were able to put skills taught in class into practice and use them effectively to obtain results that will become part of our A level coursework.

Experiments were carried out on a number of sites. For instance, on the sand dunes we investigated the percentage cover of vegetation and compiled a profile of the dunes using a dinometer.

We also had a great chance to experience the "real outdoors" - rock climbing, walking and sight-seeing on Barmouth slabs and beach."

PGCE Student Technology Teacher, Mr David Lomax, recently took part in the Three Peaks Challenge.




