

Sir William Siemens' Medal

The achievements of A Level Physics students were celebrated with the award of the Sir William Siemens' Medal to Lewis Webber and certificates to three other students - Kelly Vaughan, Simon Fletcher and Nicholas Young.

The Siemens' Medal Programme aims to encourage young people's interest in Science and Technology. All second year A Level Physics students were eligible to enter the Award. The students who achieved maximum marks in their practical coursework were invited to deliver a presentation to Mr Phil Hynds, Technical Sales Manager and Mr Roy Haworth, NVH Engineer from Siemens PLC, together with Head of Physics, Mr Martin Kirk and Mr Malcom Scotto, Senior Industrial Consultant. The students were judged on their knowledge of their subject, the content of their coursework and their presentation skills. Mr Kirk commented: "This was a tough assignment for the students and they all performed really well. We very much value the support of Siemens PLC and we are particularly grateful to Mr Hynds and Mr Haworth for their involvement. We look forward to this year's 6.2 students taking part next summer."

Duke of Edinburgh Award

There are now around 120 students participating in the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme and a presentation evening will be held later in the school year when certificates will be handed to students who have achieved their Bronze, Silver or Gold Award.

There are four sections to the Award which involve students in learning a new skill, undertaking a service to others (charity work), participating in physical recreation and planning and taking part in expeditions.

Mrs Audrey Pugh, who helps her husband Mike to run the Scheme, commented: "The students love the challenge of the expeditions which, for the Bronze Award, involves following a planned route of 15 miles over two days. At Gold level this increases to 50 miles across wild country over four days."


"Many of the students find new interests in charitable work or sporting opportunities. As well as developing their skills, they often make new friends through the Scheme."

Technology Teacher Wins 'Oscar'

Technology Teacher, Mr Jonathan Boyle was the West Midlands Regional Winner of The Guardian Award for the most creative use of Information Technology in a secondary school. The award is part of a new national scheme of Teaching Awards sponsored by Lloyds TSB which the press have dubbed 'Teaching Oscars'. TV presenter, Nick Owen who

hosted the Regional Finals in Birmingham praised Mr Boyle's outstanding work and described him as an excellent teacher and innovator. Mr Boyle then went on to the National Final which was televised live on BBC1 in July.

Eight teachers from Shropshire won through to the Regional Finals and four of them were from TTS! As well as Mr Boyle, Mr Satchwell was nominated for his contribution to leadership, Mr Berry for his work with parents in the community and Mrs Roper as the best newly qualified teacher.

Nursery Children's Gift to Hospital

Children and staff in the Nursery took part in a sponsored walk in the Spring to raise funds to buy toys and equipment for the Oncology Ward at the Birmingham Children's Hospital. They raised over £1,000 and, with the support of Little Tykes, Lego and Powerhouse, were able to provide gifts worth more than £2,000 for the young hospital patients.

Senior Nursery Nurse, Mrs Tesni Allday, said: "One of our Nursery children, William, spent many months receiving treatment for a brain tumour at the Hospital. When we visited him, we saw how much the children, who often have to spend many weeks in hospital, benefited from having toys to play with. We wanted to find a way to help and had wonderful support from families, friends as well as from the businesses. We were able to present the Hospital with televisions, video recorders and cassette players as well as toys and play equipment. Sadly, little William lost his brave battle for life in July. He was a lovely cheerful little boy and will be very much missed by us all."

Beacon Schools Project

Thomas Telford School has been designated a Beacon School by the Department for Education and Employment. TTS was one of eleven schools in the West Midlands to be awarded this status in May.

The Beacon Initiative encourages schools to work together to share best practice and drive up standards. Two secondary and three primary schools from the Donnington area will be involved in projects with us which will focus on the development of Information Technology skills, numeracy and literacy. At secondary level, development of a vocational curriculum will also be one of the main aims.

£100,000 additional funding has been provided by the DfEE for this initiative. The Government has so far established a network of 200 Beacon Schools. Their target is 1,000 by the year 2002.

Congratulations to Year 8 student, Ricky Balshaw who won three rosettes at the National Dressage Championships of the Riding for the Disabled Association held in Gloucester in July.

National Award for New Web Site

The School's new web site has won national recognition. BECTA (British Educational Communications and Technology Agency) and The Guardian UK Schools and College Web Site Awards named the site as an outstanding example of good practice in web publishing. The Sixth Form students, Nick Evans and Jonathan Will, who created the site earlier this year, travelled to London to receive their prize at a special lunch and ceremony in July. The TTS web site was one of only twelve sites across the country to receive an award and was chosen because it makes innovative

and effective use of multimedia, design, navigation and technology.

The Judges commented that "this is a very high standard of web site design including clean pages and good information provision for students, teachers and parents."

"It demonstrates interesting use of technology as a shockwave-enhanced site and through incorporating a live web cam feature and the hypertext curriculum."

Students also take part in field trips to Buildwas Nature Reserve."

Banking Rewards

GNVQ Advanced Business students, who started up a branch of Midbank last year, opened 105 accounts during the year and, as a result, have received a cheque for £100 from HSBC (formerly Midland Bank). This money will be used to support the Young Enterprise Scheme.

The students will now select, recruit and train new 6.1 GNVQ Business students to run the bank during this academic year.

Sparkling Future for Jessica

Jessica Element, who was a member of the Headship Team last year, has won a place at Robinson College, Cambridge to read Law and French. Mr Satchwell said: "I am delighted for Jessica and for the School. She is our first female student to gain an Oxbridge place. I know that with her capacity for hard work and her sparkling personality she will be a great success."

Teaching the Teachers

School Centred Initial Teacher Training Courses are run by Thomas Telford School which is the Lead School in the West Midlands Consortium.

A new Director of ITT, Alan Fowler, joined the School from John Moores University in Liverpool and in September student teachers started a new course in Information Technology. This is in addition to the established Physical Education and Design and Technology courses.

Congratulations to Year 10 student, Rebecca Simcox, who qualified to represent the Midlands in the ADFP Freestyle Championships. Rebecca went on to become the United Kingdom Under 16 Freestyle Dance Champion.

Cycling for Charity

Sixth Form Leisure and Tourism students organised a charity bike ride as part of the Relay for Life Campaign for Cancer Research earlier this year.





Mr Simon Topper, Head of PE said: "This has been a particularly outstanding year for Athletics throughout the School. Our teams have taken part in several major events and some students have competed successfully at National level. In particular, our congratulations go to Philip Nicholls who represented Shropshire and England at 3000m and won Silver medals on each occasion and to Ian Monckton who represented Shropshire at the English Schools Championships at 100m. Congratulations also to Philip and Kayleigh Orwin who represented Shropshire in the English Schools Cross Country."

Shropshire County Cup

All four of our teams - Boys and Girls Year 7/8 and 9/10 - reached the Finals of the Shropshire County Cup Knockout Competition.

Both of the Boys teams came first in their age group, with some excellent performances from Adam Welsh, Michael Prosser, Karl Guest, Wayne Davies, Danny Guthrie, Daniel Bowdler, Chris Waldron, David Blackford and Jordan Perrin. Daniel Bowdler won the High Jump and in the 80m Hurdles his time was an amazing 12 seconds exactly.




