Reports

 - End of Year Report written comments (July)



How we assess

- No grades in Year 7 and 8
- Students are monitored to see if they are making the expected progress compared to prior attainment
- Key assessments in subjects
- GCSE Grades reported part way through Year 9

- Did you raise a concern last module?
- If yes, was a satisfactory outcome achieved

Support Learning

- The internet can be a great research tool, but this needs to be filtered and monitored
- Monitor internet use closely and discuss appropriate websites and apps
- Hold positive conversations
- In school provision physical and AI filtering & monitoring



Practical Tips

- Consider the use of Google Family Link or Apple Family
- Consider the time spent in isolated areas of the house on relevant technologies
- Keep up to date with trends. We update parents via our social media platforms and mail shots
- Be aware of group chats and their dangers.....and benefits!



What to look for:

- Messages from strangers
- Friends of friends
- Invitations to meet
- Do not reply to messages that concern them. Encourage your child to discuss any messages that make them feel uncomfortable with you before they respond.



What to do:

 Report to relevant platforms and agencies any concerning behaviours. CEOP is a platform that supports reporting of inappropriate behaviour.

Attendance



Importance of Attendance

- Attendance is a focus for every school
- As a school we are making great progress to ensure attendance is a high priority for families
- However, there is still work to do. The press is releasing information revealing some reasons for higher levels of absence, these are:
- Parents working from home and find it easier to say yes to students staying home
- Students are less resilient
- Ease of working from home
- Individual attendance is vital to performance, clearly being in school will have the biggest impact on preparation for the next 5 years
- Below 90% = Persistently absent = 1 day per fortnight = 120 hours of learning per year
- Punctuality 10 minutes late once a week = 1 day over the year
